## JULY CAMPS

**MYTHOLOGY (Ages 8-14)**  
July 10-14 • 114501-C

Participants in this camp will explore the depths of all the world's myths. Harness Zeus's powers, explore the depths of the ocean with Neptune, or bring a favorite person of your own. Create a story of your own to perform featuring familiar (or unfamiliar) characters.

**BEAUTY AND THE BEAST (Ages 6-12)**

## AUGUST CAMPS

**THE HOBBIT (Ages 8-14)**  
July 31-August 11 • 114501-F

Participants in this two-week camp will perform a version of the show in All-of-us Express's library – perhaps with additions or changes of your own. Use the traditional story, or create one with your peers. Explore all the options this classic adventure has to offer.

**TEENS ON SOCIAL ISSUES (Ages 11-15)**

Participants in this camp will dive into the issues facing the world today. They will use their own experiences or the experiences of others to form discussions with their peers. From those discussions they will create monologues and short scenes to form a unique and meaningful performance.

**MATILDA (Ages 9-15)**

Participants in this two-week camp will experience the beloved story of Matilda. Campers will perform a story of their own based on the script and the movie with at least one song.
